

Denial

Denial is a normal reaction to rationalise overwhelming emotions.

It is a defense mechanism that buffers the immediate shock of loss



Anger

As the numbing effects of the denial stage of grief begins to wear off, the pain of loss starts to firmly take hold as we search for blame, feel intense guilt, and lash out.



Bargaining

Bargaining is the "what if..." stage of grief and it serves an important purpose. It provides temporary escape from pain, provides hope, and gives person time to adjust to the reality of the situation



Acceptance

Acceptance refers to accepting the reality of a loss and the fact that nothing can change that reality. This does NOT mean that the person is "okay" with the loss.



Depression
